'Somebody Loves You' message storms Vegas with Gospel mission

A 62-year-old radical, once known as a violent, dangerous combatant is now leading the force behind a cutting-edge outreach movement of evangelistic events geared to reach the lost by any means necessary.

The Somebody Loves You/Exit Concerts, scheduled to hit Las Vegas Saturday August 29th and Sunday August 30th at the Thomas & Mack Center, University of Nevada Las Vegas, 4505 Maryland Parkway, is designed to reach those in darkness; and Raul Ries is leading the pack.

"The world is no longer coming to the church for answers, so we are taking the church to them through concerts in the local community," said Ries, senior pastor of Calvary Chapel Springs. "Somebody Loves You is bringing the message of hope, love and salvation to the world, one community at a time."

The concerts, a derivative of the Friday night concerts that led to Ries' conversion in 1972, are driven by contemporary, upbeat, innovative music with the unusual mix of Christian Latin artist such as Salvador and Fernando Ortega with rock artists like Jeremy Camp, Tree63 and P.O.D.

From the time Pastor Ries received the Lord during the Jesus People Movement at

the tent with Pastor Chuck Smith, he developed a passion for wanting to reach people with the Gospel. He witnessed the success of bringing people of all cultures and faiths together during those concerts and soon began organizing his own versions at high schools and parks with the same goal – reaching the lost youth.

Effectively reaching the world for Jesus Christ and bringing more and more people together to hear the Word of God, souls were saved and the small concert outreaches grew to stadium festivals. Those festivals, which continued with cutting-edge Christian music and a simplistic Gospel mes-

sage delivered by Pastor Ries began to gain bigger venues; ultimately South America where they were re-named Escape Festivals.

Seeing thousands of lives changed and stadiums packed out on the continent, the events grew in popularity and eventually gave birth to what is now known as *Somebody Loves You*. "God's Word is powerful and is the same yesterday, today and forever," Pastor Ries said.

Besides crossing the denominational lines, the concerts are reaching beyond racial schisms and attracting an ethnically diverse audience; holding concerts in cities from Bucharest, Romania to (See *Loves You*, Page 23)

DIVINELY SPEAKING

When Shift Happens

The title of this article probably caught you off guard momentarily and rightly so, the middle word “shift” is one letter away from being considered profanity. However, it just took the insertion of only one letter to *shift* everything; the look, feel and meaning of this article’s title. *Shift* happens around us all the time; sometimes we don’t even know when it’s happening because we are insensitive to our environment, spiritually dull or simply distracted by worldly amusements. Shifts occur in an unseen world, which manifest in the physical world. The word *shift* is a verb meaning to separate, change or divide. *Shift* is when something or someone is relocated from one position or place to another. For instance, I remember when a pastor left our church to work for another ministry. Within a few years he re-joined our staff a second time but within those few years of his absence our church had changed; it wasn’t the same place he’d left a few years ago. The church had shifted to a higher plane of worship, anointing, power and activity. It didn’t take long for him to recognize he didn’t fit in anymore. He patiently endured for a season and unfortunately left again.

Everything shifts from time to time; individuals make shifts in their habits and behavior, marriages must make shifts or else suffer decay, corporations make shifts in strategy, and at times nations shift from democratic forms of government to more totalitarian structures, and vice-a-versa. When *shift* happens some things move forward while other things stay the same, when people prefer to stay in the same place they miss an opportunity to grow, advance and experience life at another level. Those who recognize and enter the new shift, experience a partial or fuller form of personal and corporate convergence. Leaders must understand *shift* so they can get a pulse for what’s changing and shifting in their personal, workplace and spiritual environment.

The principle of *shift* is made evident in a few words inserted into a census report in 1 Chronicles 12:32. A short yet simple accolade is attributed to the tribe of Issachar who “understood the times and knew what Israel should do...” 2 This tribe discerned the winds of change before the remaining nine tribes understood. Allow me to provide you with some context. This period of Israel’s history was monumental in nature, a time when King Saul’s men were at war with a group of David’s followers. At this time the kingdom was shifting from

Saul’s hands over to David’s. Saul’s power grip was weakening while David’s power and influence increased day by day. Within a short period of time only the southern kingdom, Judah and Simeon, gave David their allegiance. Seven years later, the northern (the other ten tribes) kingdom would follow suit to unite the whole nation into one entity. The reason for this slow buy-in from the north was the lack of cultivating a high level of spiritual sensitivity and discernment, which was required by Israel’s leaders. Only the tribe of Issachar is credited for discerning this shift. They were leaders of *shift*.

Shifts are not hard to follow if leaders learn to discern spiritually the winds of change, and look for their purpose in that change. Many possibilities happen during a shift, I will cover only three essential areas:

When shift happens things change

A shift creates change in the way of people do “business” as usual. A perfect example is found in Acts 17:6, when the apostle Paul and his companions were accused of turning “cities upside down...” This italicized phrase is a metaphor indicating that a dynamic shift had occurred in the daily operational affairs of doing life and business as usual. A change in the spiritual climate over the city brought about a shift in the natural operations of the cities Paul and his companions traveled. God, through his obedient servants, brought about a power shift in the struggle of spiritual powers over these cities. The hand of Providence moves through history working to bring it to reflect his glory. If we don’t pay attention and shift when God changes gears we’ll become irrelevant to the culture we are attempting to reach. It’s a sad tale for those who don’t move with history’s Storyteller.

A shift doesn’t mean we leave our values at the door; rather, we adapt to a new place and move with a whole new agenda on a different life cycle. For example, under the current Presidential administration we are moving into a new life cycle, (See Garcia, Page 19)

First valley-wide Christian music festival on Sept. 19

More than 30 percent of Nevada's population is Christian. To bring the Southern Nevada Christian community together, Free to Worship Ministries will host one of the largest Christian outdoor music festivals in Southern Nevada history Sept. 19.

Nearly 10 bands and choirs from local churches of various Christian backgrounds will provide the entertainment for the half-day music festival.

"Our goal is to truly unite Southern Nevada Christians through music and fun, and we believe we have great potential to make this a growing annual event," said Eric Fligel, president of Free to Worship Ministries, which is in the process of obtaining 501(C)(3) status.

Participating churches so far include Calvary Chapel Spring Valley, Central Christian Church, Community Lutheran Church, Cornerstone Christian Fellowship, The Crossing, Spring Valley Assembly of God, Trinity Life Center and United Students Ministries.

ing the light and grace of God through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. Local market offers affordable alternatives for seniors

Waiting in the meat line for pork chops, steak, turkey breast, chicken, and catfish around 10:30 in the morning on the second Friday of each month has its perks – if you're 55 and older. That's because Jimmy's Cheyenne Market and the Martin Luther King Senior Center, have teamed up to offer seniors in the Las Vegas area an unforgettable grocery shopping experience, at an affordable price.

"We have the opportunity to get together and bond with some of the seniors and get a feel for what they need, the type of foods they want, and we try to offer it to them at a nice price," said Jimmy Banks, owner of Jimmy's. "We package it up and sell it cheap."

The meat package deal, as it is known, offers seniors nutritional options for preparing meals at home, which is an essential part of the dietary health classes and, in part, the basis of the collaboration.

In an effort to not only teach, but most importantly provide healthy nutrition, the center offers nutritional program services like fitness, exercise, and eating lifestyles. "Some of the seniors were having some obstacles getting the types of food they needed, affordably, to supplement their households," said Ida Davis, manager of the MLK senior center. "So, we thought it would be really good to patronize businesses within our own community. Ones that the seniors were familiar with, felt comfortable with, and more so, ones that have traditional-like settings like Jimmy's."

Maintaining a standard, Banks



makes it clear that his packaged meat is different than other pre-packaged meals for seniors. "Other places have food that has been donated to them, which they put together and sort of create a meal for the seniors. But here, they see it is fresh and they see it is packaged right before their eyes," said Banks. "Even if it is pre-wrapped, it has just been wrapped, so it is fresh. That's the difference between our packages and others."

It is indeed a difference that is so greatly appreciated and accepted by those at the center. "Because the meat is fresh, not already frozen, our seniors can go home and repackage it and restore it, which we've taught in one of our previ-

ous classes, the importance of food safety," said Davis. "Some of those old mindsets of thawing meat on the counter and putting food in the freezer without labeling it are not really good ideas. So we're taking it from a very core essential point, helping them supplement their household, helping them get healthy nutrition, making sure the food is safe, thawing it properly, labeling it properly, and cooking to the right temperatures."

Keeping with the tradition of social interaction at the center, seniors maintain the same attitude as they caravan to the market once a month. "We look at it as a social event and just an all around opportunity for us to even get to know

our seniors better," said Davis. "I love the aspect that the center is just one big family. The seniors as well, are one big family."

As many communities build and bridge what is often described as a family, friendly atmosphere, over the years, Banks has created and maintained great rapport with the seniors who frequent his market. "Many of them I've waited on over the years, so they welcome me because they kind of raised me up in the business. Even a lot of the new seniors who don't really know who I am, my first time meeting them is like I've been knowing them for a long time anyway because of the warm embrace, the welcome, and the love that's shown," said Banks. "Whenever they come in, it's always enjoyable. It's like going to your grandparent's house or something like that because you're around all these wise people who are so nice and cheery."

Not only has Banks embraced the seniors in the community, but he also establishes lasting relationships. "Business is business and it's gonna always be, but you want to get something above and beyond just business, you want that relationship from the seniors and other individuals who just need that love and can appreciate that love and attention," said Banks. "And the seniors deserve it. It's well deserving because they make up this community. They guided and directed us as we were coming up, so we want to continue building that relationship with them."

Although the program is still in its early stages, Banks hopes this program will open doors for other

businesses to find a way to accommodate and reach out to the seniors in the community. "It would be nice if others would join in and create a different kind of program that's beneficial to the seniors," said Banks. "You know, the more the merrier."

In addition to other businesses establishing a variety of options for the seniors, Banks is gearing toward an even more beneficial program within the current meat package deal. "We're trying to work something out so we can offer it hopefully every week. Maybe have a senior Wednesday or a senior Thursday, something like that," said Banks. "We're also trying to connect and go to the senior housing to deliver food to them and try to accommodate them in that capacity. Sometimes they're not able to come down here to the market, so we want to be able to deliver to their homes."

As both Banks and Davis work toward perfecting the program as it continues to grow, they realize, it's a work in progress. "As we grow, we want to grow together with the senior center and hopefully we can make it a lot bigger and a lot better," said Banks. "The bigger and stronger we get, the more opportunities we have to present them with different products and better pricing. Just making a win-win situation; for us, because we enjoy having them here, and also for them, hopefully they enjoy being here."
