evening flesh to eat, and in the morning bread to the full; for that the LORD heareth your murmurings which ye murmur against him: and what are we? Your murmurings are not against us, but against the LORD.

And from Matthew 6: 11, we find these words:


Give us this day our daily bread.

Beloved, without a shadow of a doubt, we can depend on God. No matter how hard times might become, God is faithful to supply our daily bread! Without question, these are some hard times in which we live. Some of us may have seen harder times in our lifetime, but for the rest of us, at the end of each day and passing week, we look back and our souls wonder how we got over.

Now, let me drop five assurances that God supplies daily bread into your spirit, utter a prayer, and I'll holla at you later.

FIRST, GOD ALWAYS TEACHES US BY TESTING US (vv. 4-5). The provision of Manna was not just to fill their stomachs but was purposed to test their obedience to God. They were to gather the manna every day. The stipulation was that on the first five days, they were to only gather enough to eat for that day. Then on the sixth day, they were to gather twice as much so that they would have bread for the seventh day. The seventh day was the Sabbath Day and God was determined that they would keep it holy.

SECONDLY, THE MIRACLE PROVISION OF BREAD WAS A DAILY PROVISION (v. 4-5, 21). Each day, God provided the children of Israel with fresh bread. They could not keep the manna overnight, except for the bread made on the sixth day for the Sabbath Day. When some of them tried

to keep the manna overnight, it began to stink and become maggot infested. In short, the children of Israel had to trust God for their daily provision. And so it is, child of God, that we too must trust God for our daily bread even in the economic climate in which we live.

THIRDLY, OBEDIENCE PRESERVES GOD'S PROVISIONS (vv. 19-20, 23-27). God is a stickler for details. As long as the children of Israel trusted God and were obedient to God's word, their provision was preserved. But when they were disobedient (vv. 19-20), the provision got corrupted. Only on the sixth day was there an extension of the manna's shelf life for the Sabbath Day. God knew that they had to eat on the seventh day, but He did not want them to forsake worshiping Him, while being consumed with the worry of trying to prepare their daily meal. Beloved, it is our obedience unto God that ensures and maintains God's peace, provision, protection and promises in our lives. The lesson to be learned is that if we want what

God has for us, we have to do what God says to us.

FOURTHLY, DAILY BREAD IS EVIDENCE OF GOD'S GRACE (v. 12, Matthew 6:11). Look at Exodus 16:4, 12 and Matthew 6:11 again. The Israelites could expect manna every day without fail. As they learned to put their trust in God – the God, in whom they trusted, provided what they needed in their time of need. The manna was God's gift to them in the wilderness. It was their daily provision that evidenced that His "grace was sufficient" (II Corinthians 12:9).

Throughout this recession and time of economic uncertainty, it's a blessing to know that no matter how uncertain the times are God is ever faithful to give us daily bread. Everyday they had to depend on God for their daily provision – their daily bread. And everyday, we too must trust God for the gift of our daily bread.

FINALLY, GOD WANTS TO GIVE US A TESTIMONY FOR WHEN WE COME OUT OF THIS! (vv. 32-33). God told Moses to get an "omer" of Manna

(that's about two quarts to you and me) and to keep it throughout their generations so that their gen-

erations would see. That means when they entered the Promised Land, ate from the produce of the land, and the manna ceased, they would be able to show their children and their children's children what and how the Lord fed them while they were in the wilderness.

Children of God, we are in the wilderness now. The wilderness represents uncertainty, desolation, lack, emptiness, and wild growth. It is in the wilderness that God tests us and teaches us, so that when we come out of the wilderness we have a testimony of how we got over.

When we come out of the wilderness, we will have a testimony of His miracle provision. When we come out of the wilderness, we will have a testimony of how we made it day by day. When we come out of the wilderness, we will have testimony of how God made a way for us when there was no way before us. When we come out of the wilderness, we will have a testimony of how God made sure that we had daily bread.

When we come out of the wilderness, we will have a testimony of how through it all and after it all, we were leaning on the LORD!

And when we reach the Promised Land, that is when the

economy recovers, we won't ever squander, waste or take God nor God's blessing for granted again. We will forever worship the God of grace – the God who ensures that "the righteous will never be forsaken nor His seed begging bread" (Psalm 37:25).

Let us pray...

Gracious and Loving Father, I pray for all who have just read this article. I pray that they have been encouraged and that their trust in You is renewed and restored. Indeed these are economically uncertain times in which we live, but we hold on to our faith in You, O Lord, because despite the times, the Word assures us that you are the same yesterday, today, and forever. Have mercy on us when we tremble at the thought of having more month than money. Forgive us for when we put more trust in our credit cards and banks. Grant us Your peace as You provide us with daily bread. Bless us with the joy of knowing that You are always on our side. And know Dear Father, that as You bless us, we are going to bless You right back! In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

Your School's Impact on Our Community

See the grown up child standing on the street corner dealing drugs or is he handing out Gospel tracts? Is she feeding the hungry or begging for change, heading to the library or staggering to the next saloon? This is a parent's legacy and a school system's impact on our community.

The vast majority of American children attend public schools daily but more and more parents seem to be reevaluating the public school role. School choice is swelling home school and private school classrooms in Clark County and nationwide, even though this choice can mean quite a sacrifice.

The National Association for Independent Schools reports the average cost of private day schools national wide in 2005-6 was \$14,000 for grades 1 to 6, \$15,000 for grades 6 to 8, and \$16,000 for grades 9 to 12. Private school tuitions in Clark County charged from \$4,000 to \$12,000 and up in those years.

What would cause parents to consider breaking their budget to send a child to private school? For some it's religious, for some it's moral responsibility, and for others it's simply for the love of their child and a desire for a better than aver-

age future.

For religion: "Christian schools bring children in the morning, pray with them, teach them through the day from a biblical perspective, teach them the word of God, pray for them and counsel them with biblical wisdom. The Great Commission is being fulfilled in the Christian school," says Brian Hazeltine, director of the Koinonia Education Society.

For moral responsibility: "It is only by exposing children to good character and encouraging its imitation that we transmit a moral foundation for making wise decisions and appropriate choices," says Dick Ferris, education columnist for The Bakersfield Voice.

For love and future: "Three key institutions that shape a child are the home, the church and the school. Children are served best when all three institutions point them in the same direction," says James Fedele, national director of Discovery Christian Schools.

These reasonings have caused a national debate over where it is best to teach our children. A few politicians stand courageously on the "School Choice" side but the majority of our elected officials seem to be fixed against the idea.

Linda Young, Clark County School District Trustee for District

C, educated in a Catholic school, sees value in choice. "I think school choice is always a good thing for the parents and the community. Public education is a national foundation and public schools open new doors for everyone, but both the public and private school options are good ones."

She cautions, however, that there may not be enough government funds to cover both public and private school support in this economy. Public schools are suffering, she says, but there can be room for both. The competitive value of school choice should make both types of schools stronger.

"If a parent says I'm going over there to get a better education for my children I think that is fair and appropriate. If you want to be the best runner in the world you have to against the best to become the best. Competition is a good thing," she says.

Robert Mekus, principal of The International Christian Academy here in Las Vegas, says public per-

ception of public schools has helped fill his school but it is also about parental satisfaction and their hopes for their children.

"They see and read things about public schools and so they expect a higher degree of safety for the children in a private school. Academically they are demanding higher standards as well," says Mr. Mekus, who taught in the Clark County public school system for 19 years and has been principal of ICA for 9 years. "A school should reflect a parent's values and we want to bring our education closer to what their personal values are. This happens to be so important to some parents that they are willing to put forth extra dollars for this kind of education."

"Christian education makes students better people," says James Widdon, principal of Cornerstone Christian Academy in Southeast Las Vegas, and to make them better the school offers leadership education and community impact as part of their curriculum.

Cornerstone students feed the hungry and visit nursing homes, among other activities. "We share the results of Christian education in this way."

Leadership and community impact is also part of ICA's study plan says Mr. Mekus.

"That's how you learn to lead in your community. Hands on, serving students make effective and quality citizens of the United States of America."

Impact and leadership is one of the keys to sharing the Gospel, says Mr. Hazeltine, and an imperative responsibility for church schools.

"The church is bigger than Sunday mornings. The church is the body of Christ everyday.† The Christian school is the Christian church in teaching mode, and in disciple making mode."

Mr. Mekus agrees. "If we are not meeting the mission of the church why do we exist? We are very much an outreach school. If you want to be part of the community you have to pour into the community."

Spirit of Praise serves up worship to Vegas audience

As the crowd began filling up the seats at the freshly built Ebenezer Church of God in Christ in Las Vegas, it was clear that news had spread far and wide that Spirit of Praise Ministries was in concert. And although the buzz about a “worship experience of a lifetime” was swelling everywhere, no one could have predicted the Shekinah glory that filled the 850-seat capacity edifice.

“The anointing was so thick in that place, we just couldn’t interrupt it at one point,” said Dave ‘Preacha Man’ Wallace, who served as emcee for the event. “I mean, we had a praise party during one point, and then a worship timeout at another. It was an all around concert.”

The group’s second annual concert, Persuaded to Praise featured Dance Minister Rekesha Pittman, Second Baptists’ Men of Valor, and Victory In Progress (VIP) – a lineup which proved to create a perfect praise and worship combination.

Under the direction of Rochelle Schoener – co-founder and musical director for the group – the members of Spirit of Praise Ministries immediately raised the bar excellence and set the atmosphere early as they graced the stage in their royal blue outfits complimented in silver accessories. And when the first song came gliding through the microphones in perfect pitch – voices blending effortlessly – it was sure to be one of those nights.

“Spirit of Praise brought back a sound that has been missing in the industry for some time. They truly are minstrels unto the Lord and I’m so excited about this time for them because they are about to take the kingdom by storm,” said T’mil Curtis, vice president of Aneue Media Inc.

“Personally speaking I hate going to musicals. Being from Chicago, there is a musical everyday of the week. But there is no anointing and for the most part God doesn’t even know about the program, let alone show up. This concert was truly a blessed evening of worship that not only edified the body of Christ but also gave God glory,” she said.

The vocal dynasty included Tara Tatum, Darin Scales, Karen Conard, Patrice Coleman, Evelyn Kline, Monique Hawkins, Andrea Coleman, Sonya Jones and Rochelle Schoener. The musical dream team is comprised of Minister Kenny Martin Jr., DeAndre Holly, Shawn Johnson and Brian James.

Undeniably no praise and worshiper left the sanctuary empty that night, but no one was sure what truly set the explosion of praise and worship off. Some may argue it



was the dynamics and direction of Schoener that took the crowd early with More than Anything, the build of the song and the lullaby sang to Jesus by the group was flawless. “She took it to another level with that piece, and then sang on the end. Wow,” said Ted Lowery, one of the members of VIP.

Once the level of praise was promoted, Men of Valor came rushing through the place with reasons to praise him. Dressed in black, the mime team commanded the participants and a roar of praise filled the place. Victory in Progress – armed with vocal gifts, rapping rhythm and scriptural flow – swept the room with energy and captured the attention of everyone with their newest instrument of praise – the voice box.

However, audience members sprang to their feet as the group introduced Schoener’s latest project King of Glory. It may have been the way Minister Martin’s fingers danced across the organ during the jazzy piece, the tasteful rim shots of the incredible drummer Brian James, or the groovy walk of the bass guitar of Holly – but something snatched them on this song. As the vamp changed, more people begin to stand. By the time the sopranos went up in a blaze, the altos quickly burst into flames and before you knew it the tenors came behind in an inferno – it was an announcement that the King of Glory was coming.

While Spirit of Praise Ministries undoubtedly set the stage for the presence of the Lord, no one could have welcomed Him in better than dance minister Rekesha Pittman. Armed with pillars, a crown and other royal attire including her garments, Pittman welcomed the King of Glory in as she danced a liturgical piece with majesty and grace. A regal peace blanketed the audience and all respected that the ceremony for Christ had officially begun.

All that was left was to blow the

trumpets – of voices that is.

Overcome with the Spirit of the Lord, Schoener – known for her vocal splendor – seized a microphone of her own and began to serenade the coming of Christ. Unplanned, unscripted and unrehearsed, the Chicago-born native unleashed her personal testimony of worship before the packed house. Arguably, her masterful runs and indisputable vocal control could have

captured the listeners, but the anointing in her dedication to the Lord had the multitude under arrest.

Certainly the pureness and sincerity of More of You, an original piece by Minister Martin, sang directly after was considered a vocal and musical sacrifice to God. “That is going to be my coming out song,” Wallace proclaimed. “You heard it right here in front of everyone, as soon as you all drop that I will play

it every day for a year.” The intent and spirit of the song – longing and wanting to know more of Christ – left listeners in tears and eagerly awaiting his arrival.

Exhausted from the praise and drained from the worship, listeners were left with one last song to end the evening – Spirit of Praise had a secret weapon – Darin Scales. A robust tenor, Scales grabbed his microphone and left the hardwood stage and came close to his listeners and “There’s no question of your greatness, no searching of your powerÖ..” a Marvin Sapp masterpiece, You Are God Alone.

It was a night to remember for all, from the sweet sounds of Monique Hawkins singing one of the leads on Donald Lawrence’s Let The Lord Minister to You, to the velvety sounds of Andrea Coleman during Kirk Franklin’s Where the Spirit Is or the sassy vocals of Tara Tatum – there was something for everyone.


